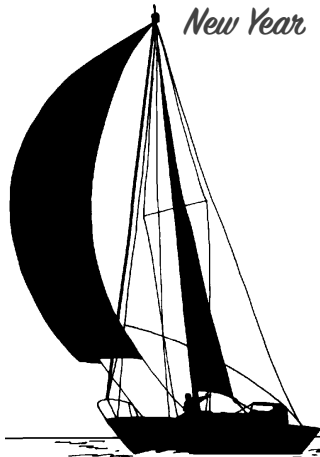

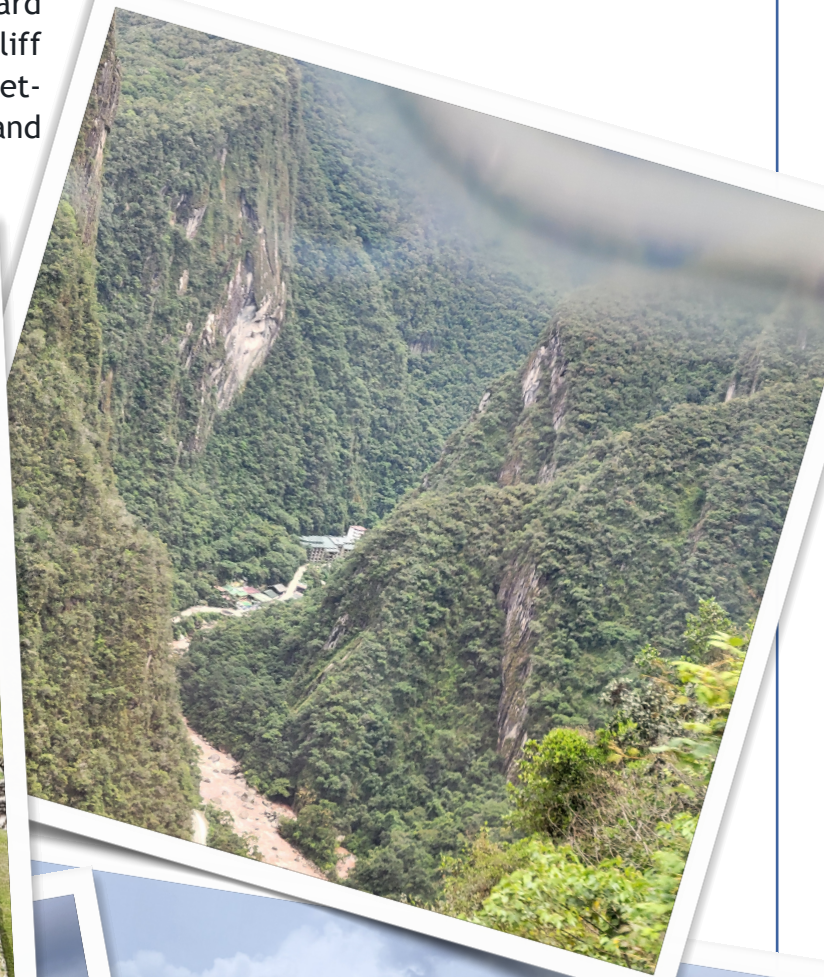
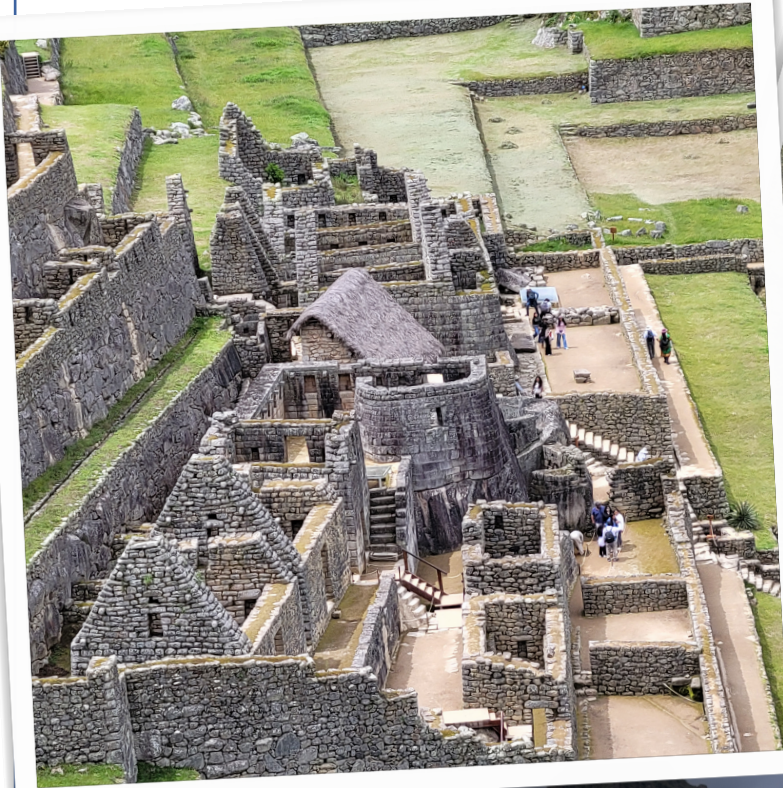

Blackbeard is everyone's club. When you join you are automatically part of "the social group" and are encouraged to volunteer to lead an event or be part of the crew.

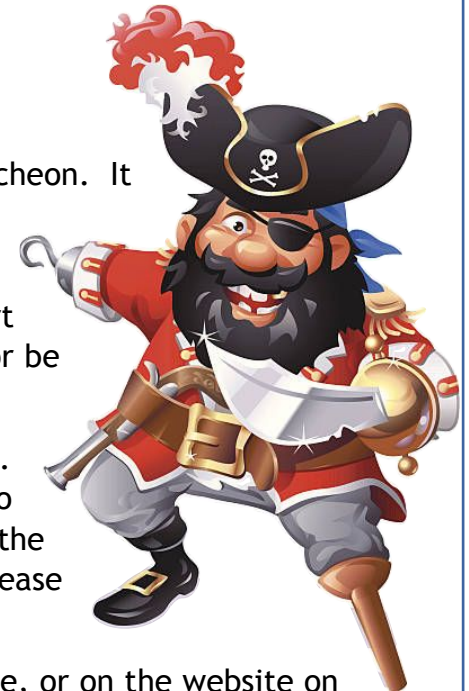

Welcome Chris & Dawn Beisner!

To the Members of Blackbeard Sailing Club,

Greetings from Chocowinity / Cypress Landing!

My wife (Dawn) and I moved here in April from metro-Atlanta where we lived for the last 20 years. We decided late last year, after having suffered a profound personal tragedy at the end of 2021, that we could do with a fresh start. In early 2024 we started looking for a new place to call home and found a great neighborhood just south of (little) Washington that ticked all the right boxes. With the new 'hood and house picked out, we quickly sold our home in GA and moved to North Carolina ourselves, our 2 wheaten terriers - Jasper and Griff - and our sailboat, a Cal 28-2.

While we love the new house, neighborhood and surrounding community, something for me has been missing. In a word that something is "racing". I LOVE racing sailboats - it's my hobby, my passion, my whatever-you-want-to-call-it. I enjoy cruiser sailing, too, but as my wife has learned from years of being with me on boats, I'm always "racing". Anyway, while the cruising here on the Pamlico River is great, the racing is almost non-existent. As this did not work for me, I've been coming down to Fairfield Harbor since September to sail on Tuesdays and, more recently, on Saturdays with my (new) friends Ed, Joan, Eric, Steve and Ray on Dutch Wind, Latitude Adjustment and Wind Dreamer. It's been great to have the opportunity to race again. What's more, BSC reminds me a lot of the club we called home back in Georgia - Lake Lanier Sailing Club, Flowery Branch - where we've been members since 2012.

At the time that we joined LLSC, I had just completed a major restoration of a Capri 22. The Capri was the 3rd keelboat and 4th boat we've owned. In order, the others were a Johnson M16 (scow), Cal 24 and a Catalina 30. The Capri was our entrance back into sailing after having taken an extended break after the birth of our son (Damian) in 2006. After giving Damian sufficient time to get his sea legs, the 3 of us did a bareboat charter in the Bahamas at the end of 2010. Seeing how well Damian did with being on a boat, Dawn was in agreement that it was time to get back into sailing on a regular basis hence the purchase of the Capri and the membership at LLSC.

Like BSC, LLSC is a very active racing club with nearly 400 members. The most popular boats are ILCAs (nee' Lasers), Flying Scots, Thistles, MCs, A Cats, J4s and Melges 24s. They also have huge junior sailing program, with Optis, 420s and Lasers, with year-round training and multiple weeks of sailing summer camps. All 3 of us were actively engaged in the club's junior program - Damian as the sailor / racer and Dawn and I serving in different capacities within the junior program (e.g., treasurer, coach, parent volunteer, travel coordinator, program administrators, etc.).

After serving the junior program for several years, I was voted onto LLSC's board of governors (in 2016) as Secretary. The following year I was elected to serve as Vice Commodore. At LLSC, the VC is responsible for ALL racing and social events throughout the year. It's a LOT of work. Fortunately for me, Dawn agreed to head up the Anchor Committee (AC). (The AC handles all the shore-side stuff for events like catering, decorating, food prep, clean-up, etc.) We made a great team. It was a grueling year but I'm glad that we did it – we learned a lot about the club, the club members, and they got to know us.

In 2018, I served as a board governor, choosing to take a year off from being a club officer after my red line stint as VC. This gave me the opportunity to recharge my batteries before being elected Commodore in 2019. Fortunately, my reign of terror (as Commodore) was a relatively uneventful in terms of club politics, weather-related damage to club facilities and properties, and insurance. Things that several of my predecessors and successors have been less fortunate with. I served one more term as the Immediate Past Commodore in 2020 before leaving LLSC's board.

Not long after joining LLSC, I got hooked up with the club's Melges 24 fleet. LLSC has the 2nd largest M24 fleet in the country with 12 to 15 boats with active participation in local and regional events by many of its members. On most Wednesday evenings, the fleet would average 7 M24s on the starting line. Getting involved with the M24s was great in terms of advancing my racing skills, teaching me proper sail trim, and giving me the opportunity to meet and sail with a number of really good sailors. My biggest highlights sailing and competing on the Melges include winning the M24 Canadian Nationals (2015) and competing in several of the largest regattas in North America, including Charleston Race Week (5 times), Key West Race Week, and the St. Pete NOODS (x8), often times against top US sailors. I love sailing the Melges and would jump at the chance to sail it or another sport boat again - nothing beats the thrill of screaming downwind in 15 – 20 kts with the spinnaker flying and a rooster tail behind the transom – but for now, I've decided to bring it down a notch and compete regionally on an MC scow. (The MC is 16 feet long, easy to trailer, and either single or double handed with a big, roachey main.) I take possession of my (new to me) MC right after Christmas. If all goes according to plan, I will dry slip the MC at BSC. Our other boat, the Cal 28-2 "Firefly", will stay here at the Cypress Landing Marina (which is 1 mile from our house).

I hope this gives you some idea of who I am (we are), my background and my enthusiasm for sailing and competing. With your support, I look forward to becoming a member of BSC and plan to contribute my time and experience to the club where I can be of most service.

We learned to sail by watching a few YouTube videos and then shoving off. Yes, we were 'that' kind of sailors. I'm sure we provided a lot of entertainment to anyone who was watching those first few attempts at sailing.

Later Woody and I sold the MacGregor 25. Woody purchased a couple of project boats, and I was without a sailboat for a few years until I bought a Flying Scot, which I still own. racing with the local sailing club. Eventually we purchased a 23-foot O'Day together and spent many great evenings sailing together on a small Midwestern lake.

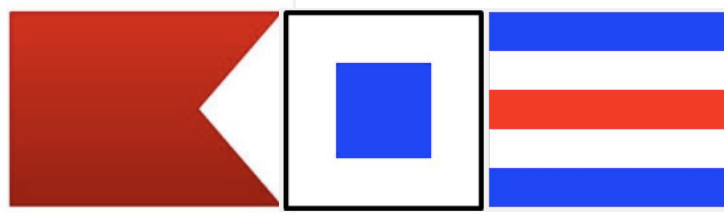

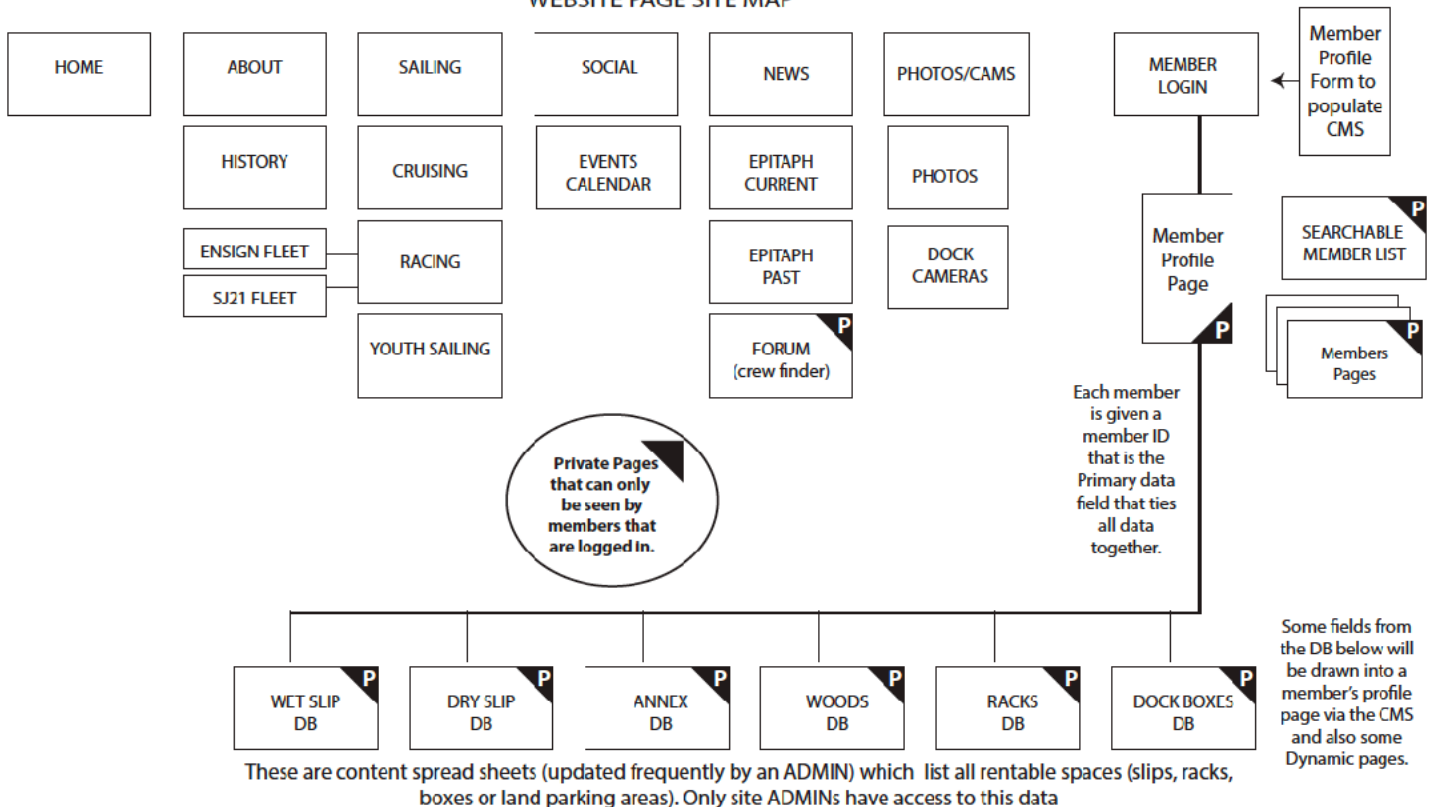
Our website has been redesigned, and as a result members must first re-sign in after a breach to utilize the new website. To do so, follow the process below:

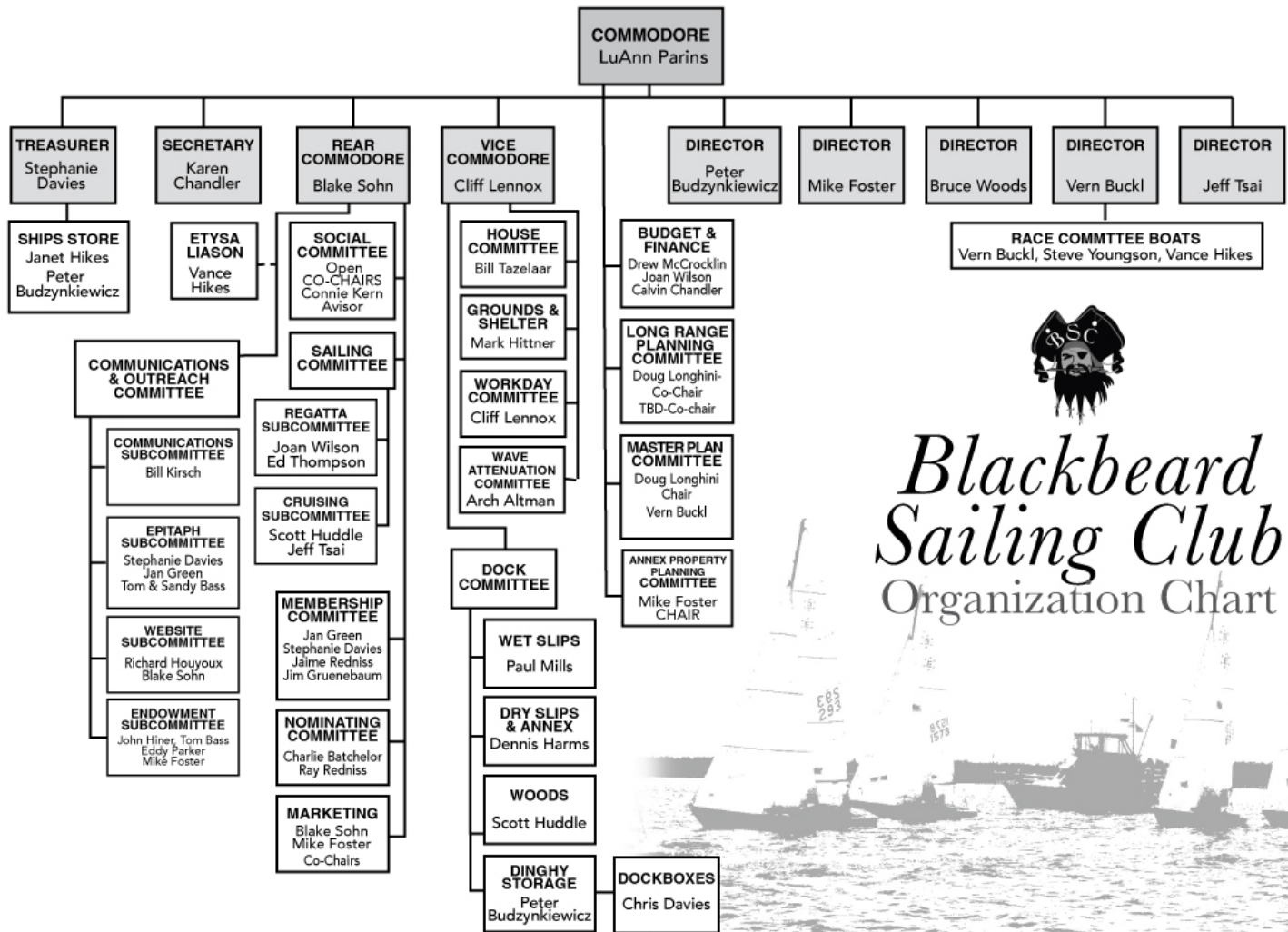
