








New finger piers on "B" Dock



Notice to Wet Slip Holders: Freezing Weather Ahead!

As you are undoubtedly aware, restoring our electric power to the clubhouse and docks continues to be a dilemma. At this time, we are continuing our search to find a qualified electrical contractor who will at least quote prices and commit to an acceptable starting date for our project. We have had some limited success in restoring temporary power to the clubhouse.

The docks however, are a more difficult issue because of the extent of damage to our entire electrical system as a result of Hurricane Florence. Therefore, members in wet slips should be prepared for freezing conditions for this entire winter season.

The BoatUS "Winterizing Checklist" below may be a handy reminder for preparing your boat for this winter. Looking forward, I am not positive that we will have power restored to the docks in the near term. If that changes, you will be informed of any updates as work progresses.
