### From the Dockmaster Inner A Dock Progress

Our Inner A dock project continues and is ahead of schedule. Work by Cahoon is nearly complete.

Additionally, repair of B dock, batter boards and reinforcing of A & C - T docks are in progress. Tide slides and hand rails will follow.

Pilings have been removed to accommodate catamarans on the split of A. Defective pilings will be replaced on outer B dock. Fire suppression has been tested and has passed, then reconnection will follow.

Electricians are currently at work on wire pulls and reinstalling powerheads.

Soon, those who have been relocated will be able to return to their new "better than before" slips...so stay tuned, a blast on that will follow.

# Blast from the Past!

This month we return to March of 1978. As noted in last month's Epitaph, it was voted to extend the main pier by adding 25 new slips. The general membership approved an expenditure of \$25,000 for the task, and in the spirit of volunteerism, it was to be built by members.

The decision to extend the dock was not without controversy, as one camp felt that moorings would be a better solution to adding more "slips." But, in the end, the pier extension went forward.

That dock (the inner part of A) lasted, with annual workday repairs, from 1978 until 2020 - a total of 42 years!!! It is hoped that the new A Dock, professionally built at a cost of 10X that \$25,000, will last as long, and will require almost no annual maintenance.

#### HOME PORT TO GET PIER EXTENSION

Blackbeard's sailors voted unanimously at the February 15 meeting to extend our present pier, increasing the docking capacity by 25 slips. Estimated date of completion is mid-June.

Commodore Drew Pledger indicated that the total cost would be in the neighborhood of \$25,000, with funding coming from the purchase of 9% bonds by club members. Based upon conservative occupancy rates, the new pier should pay for itself in five years. The Board will solicit bids on the project and will decide between another "do it ourselves" pier, a turnkey contract for a fully completed structure or something in between. Members wishing to purchase bonds should contact Drew for more details.

Flash! ! Epitaph has just learned from Drew Pledger that construction will start the week of 1 March.




Officer and Board elections were held via electronic voting ending November 6, 2020. Congratulations to those elected, or re-elected, to leadership positions in BSC!
