Planned Cruising Dates for 2022:

We would like to have a volunteer Cruise Leader for each cruise.

- April 9th This overnight cruise is approximately 15 miles away (New Bern or Club Foot Creek).
 - Backup date is May 14th. This cruise is targeted to first time small boat cruisers. All sailboat sizes are welcome.
- June 3-6th Cape Lookout cruise is approximately 9 10 hrs @ 6 mph. Backup date is June 10-13th. The trip out is split into two stages with first night at Adams Creek # Green 9 (aka Cedar Creek). Saturday Evening Dinner: Usually catered. Requires full crew of 8 or more (set-up and decorate, serve, and clean up.)


Sunday Morning:

Welcome New Members Susan & Robert Cole





Níck & Sara Placentra


