


Another Club Improvement...



2022 NYRA Parrothead Regatta

Saturday, July 23, 2022

Eleven boats registered to sail in *NYRA's 2022 Parrothead Regatta*, the annual fun, free race from New Bern to Oriental. With Parrothead's beginner-friendly "pursuit" start format, boats are assigned a PHRF rating (similar to a golf handicap) which allows boats of different sizes and speeds to sail against each other. The boats are given a start time based on their predicted time to sail the course distance (in this case, 17.05 miles). The "slowest" boats start first, followed by the faster boats. So it's simple - if you pass a boat along the way, you are beating that boat, and the first boat to the finish is the winner!



First place Overall, First place Spin - Orion

Weather was perfect for this year's event. The 7-15k breeze out of the SSW kept the boats moving, and made for a great Spinnaker run past Minnesott (for the Spin fleet, and one Cruiser who couldn't resist setting!). *Orion*, sailed by Margaret Alexander, LuAnn Parins, and Mark Weinheimer made it home to Oriental in first place overall, followed by Ed Doughty's *Bad Fish* for second in the Spin class. Third overall, and first in Cruising, went to Ed Thompson single-handing *Dutch Wind*. Jeff Boenig, with Joan, Andrew, and Skipper on board *Kokomo* passed 1SC in 4th overall, for 2nd place in Cruising.

All boats that started the race, finished the race (even the Humphries on *Covenant* overcame steering issues experienced at the start), and all enjoyed the post race social, with the Talbert's famous grog by the Tiki bar in Oriental.



Cruisers NEVER sail to a schedule, They Sail on Good Weather!

The overnight trip to New Bern for the fireworks saw about 18 club boats make the trip. Over half stayed overnight. Everyone seemed to have a good sail to downtown and, overall, a safe enjoyable trip.

Our next planned cruise August 11th - 16th is most likely to Ocracoke or Little Washington. Please let Bruce or Charlie know if you plan to go. Weather will again play a major factor in determining the destination. It has not been our friend so far this year. The tentative plans are as follows:

Skippers' meeting at 0830 on 8/11. Depart for Lower Broad Creek (River Dunes Marina area) for first night. This Day 1 is the same for either destination. Average sail time from BSC to this spot is about 4.5 - 5.5 hours.

Day 2 - Planned anchor-up at 0730. Average sail time is about 6 - 7 hrs (to Ocracoke about 7 hrs). Plan on using Big Foot (main ferry channel) or alternate 9-Foot channel. Will look for weather window on the 14, 15, 16th.

Single day return time average about 11 hrs. Two days back; can also overnight at River Dunes area or go to South River. Anchor up 8 am next day to Little Washington. Next stop for this destination is Bath. Free dock west side of town near bridge. Planned on 6 hours.

Day 3 - Little Washington. Anchor up 0800. About 4 - 5 hrs. Free dock downtown waterfront. We will explore in the afternoon and locate a dinner spot. We will also determine and plan trip back to BSC.

NOTE: Bring your dingy so you can get ashore in case docks are full.

We have several remaining planned cruises with variations expected due to weather:

- August 11th 16th TBD Most likely Ocracoke or Little Washington.
- September 10th Overnight after Shrimp-a-roo.
- September 22 25th Cape Lookout. Same plan as June 3rd. Backup date is October 7 10th




Blackbeard Sailing Club is a 99% fix and do-it-ourself club. The only main exceptions are: the once a week cleaning service for clubhouse and bathhouse, the summer lawn service, and electrical service when required.

Did you know:

The club has a night watchman. He's been on the job ever since Ken Gurganus hired him. He watches out for all the personal property, boats and gear that are stored on BSC property and docks. His name is Otto and he works for free. He guards the entrance gate and is very particular as to who he lets in.

All current members are given a membership card and gate code on the understanding that it must not be shared with non-members. This is really important, because it's BSC's Security System. Non members cannot be on BSC property as a guest unless accompanied by a member. Giving out the gate card or gate code to non-members is against club rules and can lead to expulsion.





Did you know:

On the back of your BSC gate card is the BSC Member number for Yachting Club of America. This allows you to receive reciprocal, discounted dockage at participating sailing clubs across the US. This is especially useful when cruising up and down the east coast. The Club's copy of this book can be found on the bookshelf in the clubhouse. Please do not remove.

Did you know:

The work barge at the end of B dock has proved quite useful to all members for boat maintenance/topside cleaning, etc. Please do not tie up for any long-term maintenance (more than a day), other than in an <u>extreme</u> <u>emergency</u>. If you cannot make your slip, please utilize the T docks on A & C. They are there for that purpose and can be used by all members at any time without permission.
