The goals of the 2023 BSC Cruising Committee are:

- Expand club sailing activities.
- Improve collaboration with organizations whose interests overlap with ours.
- Encourage participation of members new to cruising.
- Plan cruises so members with full-time jobs or with young children are able to participate.

The first two goals are BSC goals as seen on the banners hung from the ceiling in the clubhouse. The last two goals are in response to the recent influx of new members who may be new to the area, new to sailing, or have not done much cruising due to work and family obligations.

To encourage these members to untie the line and sail beyond the Neuse River Red "8," we will implement a Buddy System. New cruisers are paired up with seasoned cruisers as a buddy to depart together, sail close by, communicate, navigate, anchor, etc. Please reach out to the committee co-captains if this is the encouragement you need to broaden your sailing experiences.

Below are planned cruising destinations and dates for 2023. We would like to have a volunteer Cruise Leader for each cruise.

March 18 - 19: Overnight cruise to New Bern (7 NM) or Clubfoot Creek (15 NM).

Depart 1 pm after workday lunch. First time cruisers are encouraged to participate to prepare for longer cruises, and to learn from others.

April 14 - 16: Weekend cruise to Oriental Boat Show in Oriental (18 NM).

Anchor out in Oriental Harbor/Racoon Creek or reserve a slip. Boat show will occupy the entire Oriental Marina/Town Dock. Limited face-docks are available during the boat show at the Oriental Harbor Village Marina (252-671-9692). There will be street vendors, live music, etc.

May 18 - 21: Cape Lookout (43 NM).

Anchor at Cedar Creek off Adams Creek/ICW first night, proceed to Cape Lookout the second day, or to South River if conditions are rough offshore.

June 16 - 18: Weekend version.

Depart on Friday morning the 16th, anchor in South River (24 NM), join the Neuse Sailing Association on Saturday, overnight in Bay River/Vandemere, return the following day (38 NM from Vandemere to BSC).

July 4th: New Bern fireworks cruise.

Depart after the Club Hot Dog social, sail to New Bern for fireworks, and back to BSC. Some boats will elect to stay anchored overnight.

Cruising Forward

July 22 - 23: Parrothead Race/cruise to Oriental.

There is a NYRA race on Saturday to Oriental (NYRA racers anchor or get a slip Saturday night). You can elect to race with NYRA or participate as a BSC cruiser. Slip can be reserved at Oriental Harbor Village Marina (252-671-9692) or Oriental Marina Inn (252-249-1818) or anchor out.

August 4 - 6: River Dunes (27 NM).

Reserve a slip at the marina (252-249-4908) to have access to amenities, or anchor nearby at lower Broad Creek. South River is the rough conditions backup destination.

<u>Sept 22 - 25:</u> Destination TBD, make-up for canceled trip.

Oct 21- 22: Post-workday overnight cruise to New Bern or Clubfoot Creek.

Dec 2 - 3: New Bern Christmas parade and flotilla.

Expectations of Cruising Sailors:

You should hope for the best of times and weather; however, you should ALWAYS plan and be prepared for the worst-case scenarios by having the proper equipment on board your sailing vessel. Never, never sail to a schedule. Alternatives for weather are sometimes required.

Operational VHF radio with 25 watts transmit power is recommended. Hand-held radios are generally only good within a couple of miles. Communication is required. You should always stay in contact with someone in the group. Always let someone know if you change plans.

Operational anchor and rode with minimum 6' chain at the anchor, and correct size rode. Optimum anchor weight should equal one lb. per boat feet LOA. Rode should be min 100' in Neuse River. Cape Lookout, 150' minimum. Minimum scope should never be less than 5 x water depth where anchoring. For overnight, 7 to 1 is preferable. If your bow sits 3' above water, add 3' to water depth scope calculation.

Never anchor directly upwind of another cruiser sailboat. Anchor staggered off to one side and never closer than 5 boat lengths. In deeper water increase separation due to longer rode.

Dock Lines. Minimum dock lines should be four of an appropriate size (one for each bow and stern corner), plus two longer for spring lines or other needs.

Fenders, minimum is two of the correct size for the boat. Preferred is three.

Raft-up is at the option of the boat being rafted to. Rafting-up boat is responsible for lines and fenders. Generally preferred to separate and anchor prior to bedtimes, and for any approaching bad weather.

Generally, when invited to another boat or shore gathering for happy hour, you are primarily responsible for your beverages, and you should bring some snacks to share.

Please do not hesitate to refer questions on boat readiness or specific equipment concerns to us, or other club members. We are always happy to share, and find the correct source for the correct answer.

NYRA Commodore's Report

Saturday, February 18th, marked the day for the *NYRA Commodore's Regatta* - the last race of the NYRA sailing year, and the final race in the *Boat of the Year* competition! It was sunny and cold to start, with a steady breeze around 15 knots. The Navigation Fleet took off first with a modified pursuit start, followed by the Non-Spin Class with a Rule 26 start. Shortly after, amid the start sequence for the Spin boats, a wind-shift of about 90 degrees caused the Race Committee to recall the Non-Spin boats and reset the "round the buoys" course. After both the Spin and Non-Spin fleets started again, yet another 90-degree wind shift caused the RC to shorten the course for the first race to finish after the first windward/leeward leg. Once the marks were reset for the 2nd time, the breeze settled, the day warmed, and Race Committee was able to hold 3 more races for the "round the buoys" boats on a beautiful Saturday afternoon. At the end of the day, Ed Thompson's *Dutch Wind* (with a corrected time of 2:48:35) bested Cliff Lennox's *Lattitude Adjustment* (3:07:34) in the Navigation Fleet, Al Lang on *Mystic Blue* took 3 firsts and 1 second in the Non-Spin Fleet to finish ahead of Charlie Batchelor on *Jazz*, and Charlie Nelson's *Water Phantom*, with 2 race wins, bested Ed Doughty's *Bad Fish* in Spinnaker Fleet. After racing, NYRA's annual awards dinner was held at *Lawson's on the Creek* in downtown New Bern. After cocktails and dinner, the Awards Ceremony began! First up were the winners of the 2022-23 Winter Series (7 race days), where Ed Doughty's *Bad Fish* finished in 1st place in Spinnaker A, Mark Brennesholtz and *Blue Note* took 1st in Spinnaker C, Pete Thorn's *Charisma* finished 1st in the Non-Spin Fleet, and Russ Robinson on *Rampant Lion* edged out Ed Thompson on *Dutch Wind* by 1 point to win the Navigation Fleet. Non-Spinnaker Boat of the Year: Pete Thorn's Charisma

Navigation Boat of the Year: Russ Robinson's Rampant Lion

Díd You Know?...

... It is requested when BSC members go cruising in their sailboats they leave their vehicles parked in one of two locations. If departing for several months or longer, please leave your vehicles in the new annex area as shown by the red pickup truck. If leaving for several days to several weeks,

please leave your vehicles by the bathhouse as shown by the green and silver vehicles. This keeps the clubhouse area open for daily sailors.

... I bet you think that larger dock lines are better and won't chafe through. Just recently a 3/4" newer dock line attached to the starboard stern on a 39' sailboat chafed through. This is why you are required to have double dock lines on all four corners. This line was on the heave exposed southwest corner. Spring maintenance should include inspecting all dock lines. Remember, there is 3-strand dock line in the rope room available for sale at cost to club members. Just measure length through counter and record your name, member number and size/length. Cost will be added to your bill.

... The ice maker in the clubhouse kitchen refrigerator does work when the temperature controls are left set as shown. When adjusted to colder settings, the water supply line freezes.







If you can't log into the website, send a website support ticket - Menu option Website Support, then fill out your request and click Submit.




Pirate Net Map...
