Blackbeard Hosts the Sunfish

Southeast Regional Championship Regatta

Blackbeard Sailing Club hosted the US Sunfish Class's SE Regional Championship Regatta over the weekend of May 20-21. This regatta was a qualifier for sailors hoping to compete in the Sunfish World Championships, so it was an important event for the class. Some of the sailors camped on BSC grounds, others stayed with friends in Fairfield Harbour. The weekend saw varied conditions on the water, with light air at first, building a bit, and then going flat by mid-afternoon. Sunday's conditions were breezier, and by the final race we saw more wind than was appreciated. The sailors were all very complimentary about both the race management and our shore-side hospitality.

Because of our club's growing reputation for excellent race management and our great facilities, Blackbeard is becoming a sought-after venue for One-Design Championship level regattas. Given the increased interest by "outside" organizations in holding regattas at Blackbeard, the Board decided that it is appropriate to charge for the use of the Club to cover expenses. The Sunfish Regatta was our first test of this policy. The Sunfish Organization paid a "facilities fee" for the privilege of access to the property and clubhouse, with the express condition that all Blackbeard members still had full access too. Keeping order and clean-up by the visiting organization was also a condition of access. This fee is set by the number of boats coming to the Club, with increases by "brackets" rather than per boat. The Board feels that hosting regattas is in keeping with the Club's mission of promoting sailing, and is a great way to showcase Blackbeard Sailing Club. A reasonable fee to cover expenses is a sensible way to compensate the Club.

A separate charge was added for each boat that the Club provided to cover fuel costs, and all volunteers were included in meal service.

As always, it takes many volunteers to put on a successful event. Being involved in running a regatta, either shore-side or on the water is not only fun, but it is also a very interesting way to learn more about sailing while meeting other racing enthusiasts. Please consider volunteering!

The seven-date Ensign Fall Series begins September 28, hopefully with *Mutiny* back in contention, making for a five-boat fleet.

All week long the weather was forecasting a bit of rain and light winds but pleasant temperatures, and then on Friday morning poof - all mention of rain was removed from the forecast. With two groups of high school sailors attending this year, we organized a cookout so the teams could meet each other. We served hotdogs, burgers, brats and chips, while the parents provided sides to about 50 junior sailors and their parents. There was ping pong, giant Jenga, volleyball-ish and badminton. There was even a bit of late-night rubber ducky riding going on. The cookout was so successful the Club is going to try to have a cookout prior to the next two One Design Regattas.

Saturday's forecast was for 3-5 knots of wind from the E, but the wind gods didn't read the forecast and we had 8-12 knots out of the SE. Those conditions made for a wicked chop to be dealt with, but also great conditions for a sailboat race. With conditions so good, the race committee was able to get off five good races. With 7 SJ21's, 11 Sunfish and 7 420s, there was a lot of activity at the starts, marks and finishes. The first start was so aggressive on the part of the sunfish that the RC had to do a general recall and restart the race.

Saturday night featured a spread from Dank Burrito in Morehead City. They had a pork belly filling for the tacos that really won the night. I will have to make the effort to get down there and try it again. To continue with the theme from Friday, there were a lot of volleyball-ish, ping pong and other games played by the younger racers. The more seasoned racers were too tired for that foolishness after five races!

Sunday had winds building throughout the day with the first race started in about 10 knots, eventually building to gusts over 20 knots by the end of the regatta. Again, with a bunch of one design boats racing, there was plenty of excitement at the starts and mark roundings. (There may have been too much excitement at some roundings, but we won't name names.) Even with winds as strong as they were, there was only one sunfish that capsized and self-rescued, making the safety boat superfluous - which is the way we like it.

Mark Weinheimer won the San Juan fleet with six first place finishes out of 8 races. Paul Welles won the

Sunfish class by consistently finishing in the top third of the fleet, and Owen O'Rourke from RTP High School Sailing (where my daughter Sarah honed her sailing skills) won the 420 fleet. Thanks again to everyone who labored to make this an incredibly successful weekend, which really showed off our club to our guests. As an added bonus, we picked up a new member from the RTP High School Sailing team, so look for an announcement about Jeff and his family soon.

June 16 - 25, week-long version sailing with the Neuse Sailing Association

Depart on Friday 16th, anchor in South River, join the Neuse River Association's week-long cruise on Saturday to Washington, Pungo River, Dowry Creek.

July 4th, New Bern firework cruise

Depart after the Club Hot Dog social, sail to New Bern for fireworks and back to BSC. Some boats will elect to stay anchored overnight.

July 22-23, Parrothead race/cruise to Oriental

There is a NYRA race on Saturday to Oriental (NYRA racers anchor or get a slip Saturday night). You can elect to race with NYRA or participate as a BSC cruiser. Slip can be reserved at Oriental Harbor Village Marina (252-671-9692) or Oriental Marina Inn (252-249-1818), or anchor out.

Reserve a slip at the marina (252-249-4908) to have access to amenities, or anchor nearby at the lower Broad Creek. South River is the rough conditions backup destination.

Oct 21- 22, Post workday overnight Cruise to New Bern or Clubfoot Creek

Dec 2 - 3, New Bern Christmas parade and flotilla

- Clayton and Diane Brice on White Lightning


New members Ron & Shelly Townley on *Good Fortune* were traveling with the group but were not at this overnight stay.

NYCC was an awesome Club with exceptional hospitality and a fabulous restaurant and showers. They celebrated their 125th anniversary in 2021.


BSC's membership in the Yachting Club of America facilitated the reciprocity.

Charlie had contacted the club and made the arrangements. Stephanie had provided the BSC member letters of introduction. Look at the information on the back of your gate card.





