#### Thank You!


Members,

#### Did You Know...?

Did you know there is a new rope room? It's located in the "old" outboard motor room on a movable cart, with foot counter attached. The lock combo is still the same as was used on the former rope room. In case you have forgotten, it is the year BSC was founded. ## Lithium Battery Upgrade

I recently "bit-the-bullet" and decided I wanted a lithium iron phosphate house battery bank. In doing a little research online, I quickly learned that it is not exactly a simple project. The main issue is that you still have to crank your engine with a lead acid battery, and be able to charge your lithium batteries while motoring. However, engine alternators cannot directly charge lithium batteries without burning up the alternator (due to different chemical resistance in lead vs lithium batteries). So, I needed to install new house bank wiring, and to separate the lead from the lithium circuits. That's where you can go down a rabbit hole researching online. I talked to my friend and club member Steve Youngson (with Youngson Marine Electronics), who has experience with battery and marine electronics upgrades. Steve came on Methuselah twice to provide a cost estimate, and assess the situation on my boat (mainly tracing unlabeled wires). Then he provided me with a custom design, including detailed drawings. Steve ordered the batteries and all the proper cables, fuses, etc. I helped Steve during the two full days of installation (for my own learning). Steve was very meticulous and did an excellent job. The key benefits are: 1) increased battery amp hour capacity; 2) real-time battery capacity monitoring; 3) no more replacing lead batteries every few years; 4) much lighter and smaller batteries; and my favorite, 5) the robust heat shrink label maker that Steve used to identify all my wiring for future reference. Of a possible 15 races scheduled this fall, the Ensign fleet has only completed seven. Three boats have first place finishes in the seven races - very democratic! A collision early on when Blue Note erred and t-boned Red Stripe caused considerable damage. Mark Hittner put in 32+ hours repairing Stripe, which never missed a race, but both of us dropped out of that race after the collision.

#### YRA Halloween Regatta

A lovely but fickle day greeted the thirteen entries in the annual Halloween Regatta. On a shortened course, seven Navigation Class boats raced up to the bridge and back in under two hours. Scott Huddle in *Methuselah* corrected first by less than two minutes over John Jackson's *Georgie Girl*. Paul Mills was third in *Vertical Wing*. In the closest results, Mark Hansen and crew aboard *Next Hitch* beat Arch's *Mighty Fine 2.0* by 27 seconds.

Racing closed courses, including a triangle WL first race, six Spinnaker Class boats enjoyed pleasant breezes and annoying calms. The wind at the windward mark under the western shore of the Neuse caused many lead changes, and boats beating in the same direction on

opposite tacks. Even the spinnaker runs were tricky in the various wind streaks. Of the three boats in Spin A, Tom McKnight in *Anathema* and Ed Doughty in *Bad Fish* dueled each other all day, correcting within seconds every race. Their ratings are nearly identical. Tom won two of the three races after Ed won the first one. Charlie Nelson raced *Water Phantom* to thirds. Spinnaker C (no "B" entries) had three boats. Buddy Dillinger in his pretty Olsen 25 *Red Stripe* (no relation to the Ensign of the same name) won the second race while Ensign *Blue Note* took the first and third. In the second race, it seemed as if whenever we tacked, it was into a header. Pete Thorn in *Charisma* struggled with his first time in the Spinnaker Class, but that's how a crew learns.
