If you were wondering, water will be back on when the powers-that-be determine we are frost free. Please be patient.


Remember that the Club requires boats to have current registration. Please update yours if it is 2023 or older.



Looking Back at the ICRC

Thanks to Bill Kirsch, Mark Brennesholtz, Charlie Nelson, Joe Valinoti and Eddy Parker for their input.

The story begins back in 2001, when Mark Brennesholtz called a meeting of representatives from all the clubs holding regattas on the Neuse and Pamlico Rivers. The clubs included Blackbeard Sailing Club (BSC), Oriental Dinghy Club (ODC), Neuse Yacht Racing Association (NYRA), Fairfield Harbou r Yacht Club (FHYC), Neuse Sailing Association (NSA), Hancock Yacht Club (HYC), and Pamlico Sailing Club (PSC). At the time, there were quite a few regattas each season, and there were many conflicting events. Mark's idea was to develop a "master" calendar of events and coordinate among all clubs to eliminate conflicts and increase participation in each club's "major" regattas. After several tries, the group worked out a schedule, and several events were "protected" against conflicts. Thus was born the "Inter-Club Racing Committee" (ICRC).

Mark also suggested creating a team series, with each club sending a 5-boat team to compete in several regattas for a season championship. The idea was to have a few "first class" regattas with shirts, free dockage and beer, nice meals and trophies, and maybe even a band at the Saturday social. The first re-

gatta of the ICRC was held in Oriental on the first weekend in August of 2002. Mark still has a t-shirt, pictured at the end of this article. That event later became known as the Dragon's Breath and, though it has moved to June, the regatta is still hosted by ODC every year. Five clubs pitched in some funds that first year to make it a great event. Dick Horn, a BSC member, donated a huge trophy (with a plate for each season's winning team) to stand as the perpetual award. That trophy is in storage at First Citizens Bank in Oriental and shows the dominance of ODC through the years of the team series.





Looking Back at the ICRC

The series was originally intended to include at least 3 regattas hosted by different clubs. The earliest reference I have shows the intent to have one event by BSC, one by ODC and one by PSC. To compete for the series championship, a club must have a 5-boat team in at least two of those events. As I recall, PSC didn't bring a team for long, but I have learned that PSC hosted at least one event in Bath. NYRA had a team for about six years, but it looks like NYRA and BSC consolidated their fleets after that. The major competition devolved to ODC vs. BSC.

Each winter, the ICRC would meet to go over the schedule and plan the team series for the year. For the first decade, or more, Mark was the "Chairman" of the ICRC. In 2011 (or so), Charlie Nelson took over as "Chair" of the group. Charlie ran the committee until 2022, after which he stepped down. Bill Kirsch was on the board for the entire twenty-some years, as he handled the calendar scheduling, and "herded cats" from the participating clubs to avoid conflicts. Only last year did Bill cede the job of updating the Interclub calendar, but he is still supporting the ICRC (behind the scenes) with his knowledge and skills.

The record of participation by club in two major events over the eleven years of 2003 - 2013 (thank you Bill!) tells the tale of declining fleets. While BSC participation at the Dragon's Breath remained rather steady at 6-9 boats (2012 had 9), and ODC stayed very strong, with a peak of 24 boats in 2007 and still having 14 competitors in 2013, PSC participation dwindled from a peak of 11 boats in 2004 to 0 by 2008, 3 in 2012 and back to 0 in 2013. NYRA participation fell from a peak of 10 in 2004 to 0 by 2012 and 2013. ODC continued to bring a good fleet to BSC for its annual event (the ECB Cup or ETYSA Regatta), peaking in the first year with 13 boats, then dwindling over the years to 6 boats coming to BSC. Unfortunately, I don't have a record of NYRA or BSC participation in the BSC event over the years.

The last year that is commemorated on the perpetual trophy is 2015, but I have a few documents from 2016. In February that year, a subcommittee of the ICRC was formed that approved new rules for "Regional Championship Events" on the Neuse, replacing the "ICRC Club Championship." This agreement split the River at Wilkerson Point (Minnesott Beach) into "Upper" and "Lower" regions and required skippers to declare their region and be a member of a regional club. Each region was required to have a minimum of 5 boats competing in the ODC "Dragon's Breath" and the BSC "Sound Bank ETYSA Regatta" to be eligible for the Regional Championship. A "SOTY" (Sailor of the Year) award would be presented to a skipper in each of the Spinnaker and Non-spinnaker fleets (not "Cruising") that accumulated the best scores in a minimum of four out of eight specific regattas.

ICRC Team Scoring Concept:

- There are 3 major races each year 1 each at Blackbeards, Oriental Dinghy Club and Pamlico Sailing Club.
- A team consists of a minimum of five boats. A club must have a team in at least 2 of the 3 ICRC regattas.
- The team that scores the lowest total of 2 combined team events, wins the trophy for the year.
- The score consists of counting the 5 lowest scoring boats of the team. Eg: 3 firsts, 2 seconds = 7 pts total.
- A team can use only one score from a 'One Design' class of boats i.e: Ensigns & San Juan 21's.
- In scores shown below, you may see more than 5 boats scored. The total will reflect only 5 but if more than 5 are shown, there would be a tie amongst team members so that more than 5 names will appear
- ICRC stands for "Interclub Race Committee" which was formed in Jan, 2002 by 7 Neuse and Pamlico River clubs. Those organizing clubs were: Oriental Dinghy Club, Blackbeard Sailing Club, Hancock Yacht Club, Pamlico Sailing Club, Fairfield Harbour Sailing Club, Neuse Sailing Assn & Neuse Yacht Racing Assn. (ODC, BSC, HYC, PSC, FHYC, NSA & NYRA)
- ICRC's original founding fathers from ODC include: Gary Johnston, Bill Croughwell & Bill Kirsch

Looking Back at the ICRC

In 2016 ODC won the Regional Championship and ICRC trophy once more because that was the only club to fulfill the 5-boat requirement at both regattas. Joe Mattea of ODC won SOTY with a "perfect" score in the non-spinnaker fleet. My interpretation of the "standings" sheet indicates that Henry Frazer won Spinnaker SOTY.

2016 is the last year that I have any documents. By that year, few sailors were willing to move up and down the river for weekend events due to the logistics and expense involved. ODC started hosting more "club" events that gave Oriental boats plenty of sailing. NYRA and BSC stayed up near BSC. HYC's annual regatta, NCOC and the "Michelob Cup" (renamed the "Beer Stein Regatta" at some point due to sponsorship changes) withered away several years ago, giving even less incentive for skippers to move their boats up and down the river. Only a few BSC boats compete in the Dragon's Breath and Oriental Cup, and no ODC boats have come upriver for PHRF events since before 2020.

However, the ICRC survives with its original concept (the master calendar of events) intact. The acronym now stands for the "Interclub Racing Calendar" and is updated every year with input from every

club that cares to respond to inquiry. The intent is still to promote cooperation among the various clubs that host regattas on the Neuse and minimize conflicting events.








Did You Know?...


